

Pastor's Ponderings

Why Observe Lent?

Not that long ago the practice of observing Lent was something new for Presbyterians. Many of us will recall folks with a dark smudge on their foreheads and figure it must be Ash Wednesday and they must be Roman Catholics or Episcopalians. And then, we, along with many, started having Ash Wednesday services and observing Lent.

So, why have we taken on this observance? Here are a few observations and thoughts.

Lent has been the practice of many Christians for centuries. Lent is the Christian season of preparation before Easter. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent, which begins forty days prior to Easter. (Sundays are not included in the count).

Lent is a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline. In the early Church, this was the time when those seeking to be baptized (*catechumens*) would enter into preparation for receiving the sacrament of Baptism. Today, the church regards Lent as a time of looking inward, examining our lives and remembering our mortality. The purpose is to set aside time for reflection on Christ - his life, death, burial and resurrection.

There's something to be said for joining with other Christians around the world and down through the centuries. What better way to feel connected as we move through the weeks of Lent knowing others are going along this journey as well.

It is noteworthy that things come full circle. The palm branches from Palm Sunday are burned and the ashes used for the Ash Wednesday service.

My appreciation for the Lord's Supper has deepened as I realized the significance of that meal. It is during Holy Week, Jesus' last days on earth, that he shares that meal with his disciples. On Maundy Thursday evening as we gather for worship, I am always struck as we prepare to receive the bread and the cup. I often have a lump in my throat as I say those time-honored words, "On the night before our Lord Jesus was betrayed...." We are following Jesus' command as we share together communion.

And any occasion that compels us to examine our life and faith is a good thing. By engaging in times of prayer and reading the scriptures, we come face-to-face with our Lord.

For all these reasons and more, I encourage you to observe a holy Lent. Ponder these two scriptures:

- Examine yourselves to see whether you are living in the faith. (2 Corinthians 13:5)
- · Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. (James 4:8)

Our Giving

The 2013 Budget has been included in this newsletter as a way of sharing with the congregation what the session anticipates our giving will be in 2013. This budget will guide the committees in their work throughout the year.

Your generosity through your pledges and your giving provide the means by which we do ministry at the Orange Presbyterian Church. We are a generous congregation gave more than \$26,000 to benevolences in 2012 (\$14,400 through our budgeted line items and another \$12,352 through our special Presbyterian offerings, the Christmas bazaar, and the Clean Water Fund).

Even when your pledge is undesignated, your giving is being used to provide many outreach ministries. Think about all the groups who have an opportunity to meet in our facility because we provide heat and light. Think about activities such as Vacation Bible School and our Preschool who reach out to others in the community. We are a presence in the Orange community because of the work and ministry we do.


